## Summary:

**Topic:** Global Citizenship

**Dates:** August 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023 to September 9<sup>th</sup>, 2023

Students arrive on August 29<sup>th</sup> and depart on September 10<sup>th</sup>

**Number of students:** 15 (min)-20 (max)

**Instruction Hours:** 42 hours total (23 hours in the classroom and 19 hours of site visits)

Classroom instruction is at SU, every morning, 9-12; the site visits are typically in the afternoons, 1-5, with the exception of a visit to Bainbridge island which will be on a Saturday morning.

The goal of site visits is to expand students' knowledge of the topic and to help them learn how the issues they will be discussing in the classroom work out in the real world. Students will have related assignments before, during, and after site visits. Each site visit will focus on a different aspect of global citizenship. For example, at the visit to Bill and Melinda Gates foundation students will hear about the foundation efforts in the fields of global health and education while a visit to Theos Chocolate Factory will include a presentation on fair trade practices.

**Cultural Activities:** 24 hours total

The purpose of cultural activities is for students to learn more about American culture, get to know Seattle, and practice their English in real-life situations. Cultural activities will be lead by Cultural Guides who are typically SU students

**Accommodations:** Students stay in home-stays (not arranged by SU)

**Meals:** Students can bring their own lunch, purchase something in the University's cafeteria, or choose one of the many restaurants close to the campus.

**Transportation:** Seattle University will provide public transportation cards (ORCA cards) for students to use to get to and from school and for afternoon activities.

**Entrance Fees:** Entrance fees for all scheduled activities are included in the program.
